Basic Rules for RING Riding

	What	Why	
1.	Keep your distance How many horse lengths between riders??	Crowding is rude and may upset other horses	
2.	Be of your surroundings - know where the other horses & riders are. Control your Pony!	It's dangerous to have a pony out of control.	Are You Paying Attention?

6.	Tell the dangers Point out to other riders	It takes a village. It feels good to be helpful to others.	
7.	If you must pass, turn and ride or circle back to an space.	You don't want to crowd or upset other mounts by passing too close. <u>Never pass</u> <u>between another</u> <u>horse and the rail</u>	
8.	If other riders present, call your "Heads-up on the rolltop"	You and others could get hurt if there is a collision, especially when jumping	
9.	If riders going in different directions, pass like driving a car; shoulder to shoulder.	Less collisions if we all follow the same rules	
10.	If your pony kicks, put a in the tail. BUT you are still responsible for keeping control of your pony.	Knowledge is power Because it is the right thing to do.	

11.	Be friendly and polite when you meet others. Don't interrupt, or ride through others who are in or	You don't want your lesson interrupted. Neither does anyone else. It's rude to be rude. Treat others the way you want to be treated.

Rating Requirements:

D1- Name basic rules of safe riding in a group in an enclosed area.

- 2. Move to center of ring if need to stop.
- 3. Notify others when entering, jumping, passing, see dangerous situation.
- 4. Keep safe distance 1 horse length away, don't crowd others.
- 5. Mind your manners, don't interrupt or ride thru lessons or clinics.
