Post and Rail	1	Also called "Upright" Planks or poles with no

Table Jump		A wide, flat jump

Arrowhead		Also called "Chevron"

Gate	Reproduction rights obtained in fore worse. Cartoon Drock com	A vertical jump.
Oxer (Ascending)		Two or more verticals placed, & jumped, together. Also called a "spread" The closest pole the lowest.  Standards not connected.
Oxer (Triple Bar)		Three rails all attached to the same standard.
Соор		Triangular, widest at bottom. Very common on cross country courses.
Triangle Fence		Also called a "tiger trap".
Ski Jump		Only ½ of a triangle  Also called "Ramp"
Fan		Rails on one side are spread out with standards to look like a fan when viewed from above.
Water Jump		Any jump where your mount will touch the water, either before or after jumping, or both.

Bank	Any jump where your mount will jump up or down to another plane.

Trakehner	Rail (log) over a ditch

Skinny	Distance between the standards is reduced
Combination jumps	Two or more obstacles to be jumped as one; usually labeled A and B.
Closed Combination	A combination of two or more sets of jumps where the sides are closed in and the only way out is by jumping. Not allowed for D rates.
Combo: Bank & Water	
Comb: Ditch & Brush
