## Canter

(1st beat) right hind leg
(2) 1
(2nd beat) left hind / right fore (3rd beat) left fore leg

## Gallop

The Left-Lead Gallop:
(1st beat) right hind leg
(2nd beat) left hind leg
(2) (1) (3rd beat) right fore leg
